Before joining Atlanta Mission, Reese held the following key business leadership positions:

He was an Executive Board member of Netherlands-based Randstad Holding NV, and the Chief Executive Officer of Randstad North America with oversight for Randstad United Kingdom. As CEO of Randstad North America, Reese had responsibility for more than 500 offices and 2,300 staff members, who together put more than 53,000 individuals to work each week across the United States and Canada. Other positions held at Randstad were Chief Operating Officer of Randstad North America and Managing Director of Operations for Randstad North America's Southeast Division, the company's largest operating division.

Prior to joining Randstad, Reese was Chief Operating Officer for the HoneyBaked Ham Company; Division Vice President of Operations for Frito-Lay, the Snack Food Division of PepsiCo, and spent sixteen years at General Foods.

In 1980, Reese earned his B.B.A. in Marketing and Business from Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo, Michigan. Recognized in 2015 - 2017 in Atlanta Business Chronicle's Top 50 Influential Non-profit Leaders, Reese has addressed audiences at Yale University, Western Michigan University, and at various business conferences.

Reese serves on several Boards, including Chick-fil-a Foundation, Mid Oaks Investments, and was the 2017 Board Chair of the Association of Gospel Rescue Missions. Reese lives in North Atlanta with his wife, Dina.

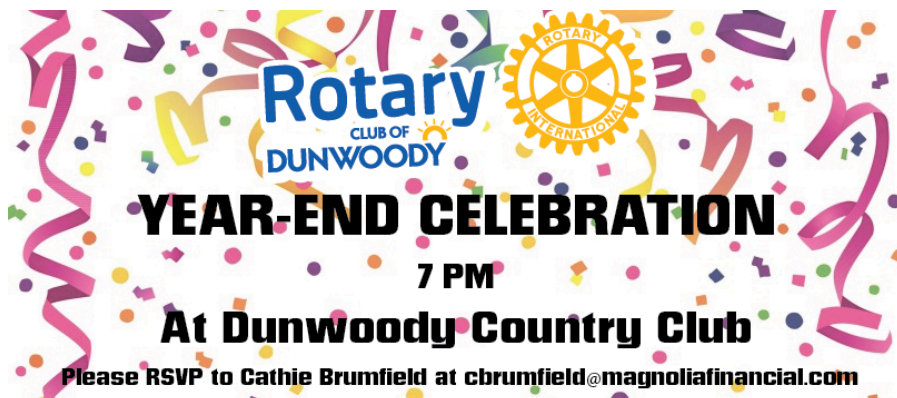

What are the responsibilities of a host family?

To accept the exchange student as a new member of your family. The student will be governed not only by the rules of the program but by the rules of your household. You are responsible for the safety of the exchange student the same as for your own children. Although you might become a bit more of the soccer mom or dad for normal everyday activities, it is not your responsibility to act as a taxi service or a tour guide. Rotarians for the hosting club will be helping in these areas.
