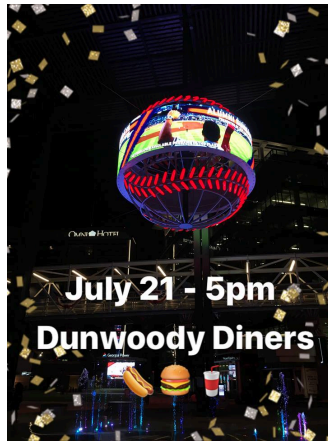

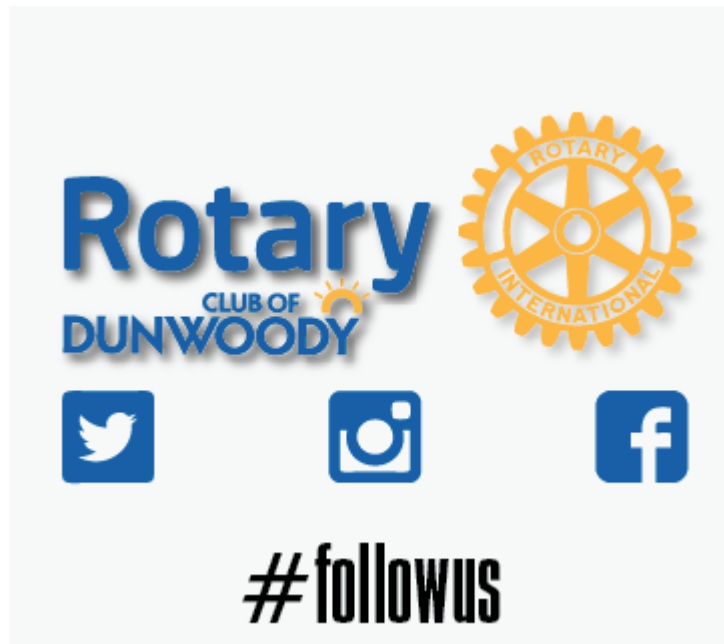
at Atlanta's Perimeter Mall
